Spill Reporting

	Threshold	Reference	Comments
Waste Oil	Any Harmful Amount	Water Quality Regs Section 11(2) and (3)	Where any contaminant is spilled that may result in water pollution in any waters of the Province, the person who spills such contaminant shall take adequate action to minimize the water pollution and shall report the spill to the Minister immediately, which report shall contain <i>(a)</i> a description of the contaminant, including its volume and the location of the place where it is spilled, <i>(b)</i> a description of the water pollution which may result, including a description of the waters affected, <i>(c)</i> the cause of the contamination, and <i>(d)</i> any remedial action taken or to be taken to minimize the resulting water pollution and to prevent a recurrence.
